Use of these facilities requires a membership card or wristband, which are issued annually in January for member's current with dues.

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#### What Your POA Enables:

The developer set up the community as a Property Owners Association (POA) responsible for common property maintenance as well as establishment of requirements for owner property improvements and upkeep.

The POA Board and volunteers take an active role in supporting community involvement, property improvements, and making the community a desirous place to live.

Your community dues provide the necessary funding to support these objectives. Principle expenditures include:

- Operation and maintenance of the POA office and community center
- Road maintenance
- Mowing of the common properties, right-of-way's, and owner funded property maintenance
- Electricity for most of the street lights in the community
- Insurance for the common properties and association liability
- Repayment of a loan taken to restore the community center following storm damage
- Payment of taxes for the common properties

## **Burning Rules of Note**

Burning within Henderson County is regulated. Key requirements include:

- Burning must be started and completed between sunrise and sunset
- Prohibited items include tires, oil, PVC, treated wood, mattresses, paints, etc.
